Author guidelines

Articles for Journal of Wound Care

All material submitted for publication must be submitted exclusively to JWC.

All articles will be sent for peer review. JWC will not accept material submitted to, or published by, other journals or books.

The editor reserves the right to edit material accepted for publication

Proofs of articles are sent to authors to check clinical and statistical accuracy. Major changes to text or tables at this stage are not permitted.

Please ensure that anything you submit conforms to the uniform requirements for manuscripts submitted to biomedical journals, and that the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE) guidelines on good publication practice are adhered to. For more information, visit:

Information that needs to be included

All papers should include:

- Title
- Names, addresses, and positions of all authors, plus an email address and telephone number for the corresponding author
- A competing interest statement and/or declaration of interest for all authors/contributors
- Details of ethics approval (or a statement that it was not required)
- Details of funding (research studies).

If you are submitting a randomised controlled trial, please send a checklist and flowchart in accordance with the CONSORT guidelines, which are available on: www.consort-statement.org.

Please submit the checklist as a supplementary file and the flowchart as Fig 1 in the manuscript.

Authorship and contributorship

Please refer to 'Uniform requirements for manuscripts submitted to biomedical journals' on www.icmje.org/index.html

Authorship credit should be based on:

- Substantial contributions to the conception and design, or acquisition of data, or analysis and interpretation of data
- Drafting the article or revising it critically for important intellectual content
- Final approval of the version to be published
- Each author should have participated sufficiently in the work to take public responsibility for appropriate portions of the content.

Contributors who do not meet the above criteria for authorship should be listed in the acknowledgements.

They may include persons who provided technical help, writing assistance or data collection. As readers may infer their endorsement of the data and conclusions, all persons must give their consent to be acknowledged

Where a patient's or employer's consent is required, this must be obtained by the authors.

Authors should keep copies of material as no responsibility can be taken for its return.

Manuscripts

Papers can be submitted to the editor by post on a disk or CD, or via email.

Tables should be created using tabs, not spaces, with one tab

between each column. Also, a word-processing table creation facility can be used.

Illustrations

Illustrations are welcome. Jpegs are favoured, but a minimum of 300dpi is required.

Clear black-and-white photographs or colour transparencies are also suitable.

Rough diagrams can be redrawn. If charts or graphs are to be included, original coordinate values should be sent.

Captions should be supplied for all illustrations, which should be referred to in the text.

An acknowledgement must be given where material has been copied from another source.

References

Vancouver referencing system is used. References must be keyed into the text by superior figures and listed in numerical order.

For books, the publisher and year should be included.

References to articles must include: the title; authors' name(s); journal title; date; volume; issue; page numbers.

Where there are four authors, all should be named. If there are more than four, three should be named with 'et al'. Full details of each publication should be kept.

Copyright

Contributors will be asked to assign copyright to Emap Public Sector, part of Emap Communications; permission to republish elsewhere is usually granted on written request.

Authors' reprints

Reprints are available for purchase only. However, 10 free colour photocopies of the published paper will be supplied to authors on request. ■
